

Swim club celebrates

SWIMMING: Pelican Waters Caloundra Swimming Club has celebrated a stirring season, which included breaking a national record.

The club has recognised its top performers, with five senior swimmers competing at this year's Australian championships.

That group was led by ex-Commonwealth Games medallist Tessa Wallace, who claimed gold in the 200m breaststroke to secure a place at the world championships at Russia next month.

Her coach and father John was selected as part of the national coaching team.

Nine from the club competed at the age national championships this season, including Kaylee McKeown, who won the 12-13 years girls 100m backstroke (1min02.23sec), breaking the Australian record.

Chloe Baldwin received the Sunshine Coast Sports Federation's Special Olympics award for 2014.
